1 Initial Statement

United States of America Before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Application for Surrender of License for Major Project

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) submits this Initial Statement as part of its Application to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) for Surrender of License (Surrender Application) of the Borel Hydroelectric Project, FERC No. 382 (Borel Project). This Surrender Application is prepared in conformance with Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), Subchapter B (Regulations under the Federal Power Act [FPA]), Part 6 (Surrender or Termination of License).

The Commission's regulations do not include a form for initial statements associated with a surrender application. Because the Borel Project is a major Project at an existing dam, SCE has used the form at 18 C.F.R. Section 4.51(a) as a guide for preparing this Initial Statement, which includes specified general information about the Borel Project, SCE, interested resource agencies, Native American Tribes, and state and local governments. This Initial Statement conforms to the regulations in 18 C.F.R. Section (§) 4.51(a) pertaining to the contents of an Initial Statement, and in 18 C.F.R. Section 5.18(a) that require, in part, that an application include certain general information.

5. SCE's Organizational Status

SCE is a domestic corporation of the State of California. SCE is not a municipality for purposes of the FPA; regardless, the preference provisions under Section 7(a) of the FPA do not apply to a surrender of license.

6. Pertinent California Statutory and Regulatory Requirements

The statutory or regulatory requirements of the state in which the Borel Project is located that affect the Borel Project, as proposed, with respect to bed and banks; and to the appropriation, diversion, and use of water for power purposes; and with respect to the right to engage in the business of developing, transmitting, and distributing power, as well as any other business necessary to accomplish the purposes of the license under the FPA include the following:

- California Water Code Section 13160; Title 23, California Code of Regulations Sections 3855-3861 – California Water Code Section 13160 designates the California State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) as the state water pollution control agency for the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and any other Federal act. Title 23, California Code of Regulations, Sections 3855-3861, specify requirements and procedures for applications for water quality certificates required under Federal law.
- SCE will apply to the SWRCB at the appropriate time in the license surrender proceeding for Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification and provide a copy of the request to FERC.
- The Federal Consistency Unit of the California Coastal Commission implements the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) of 1972 as it applies to Federal activities, development projects, permits and licenses, and support to state and local governments. In the CZMA, Congress created a Federal and state partnership for management of coastal resources. The Federal government certified the California Coastal Management Program (CCMP) in 1977.

SCE will consult with the California Coastal Commission and file with FERC documentation of the consultation with the California Coastal Commission.

Although not required by Section 4.32(a)(3) of the Commission's regulations, beginning in December 2020, SCE notified all landowners of properties within and adjacent to the Borel FERC Project boundary regarding SCE's license surrender. SCE sent Borel Project communications to 215 property owners and met with many of them during dedicated landowner meetings and public townhall meetings. SCE has and will continue to make information available to these property owners throughout the license surrender process. More information is available in Volume IV - Record of Consultation, which provides a description of SCE's consultation with stakeholders regarding decommissioning of Borel Project facilities and surrender of the license.

- Volume III includes an Applicant-Prepared Draft Environmental Assessment. This document provides an assessment of environmental effects due to the implementation of SCE's proposed Decommissioning Plan and measures.
- Volume IV includes a Record of Consultation. This record provides a description of SCE's consultation with stakeholders regarding decommissioning of Borel Project facilities and surrender of the license.
- Volume V includes non-public, privileged information and compiled data with regard to precontact and historic-era archaeological resources, historic built environment resources and Traditional Cultural Properties, as well as a record of consultation with Native American Tribes and agencies, as appropriate.

All portions of the Surrender Application are public with the exception of Volume V that contains CUI//CEII and is filed with the Commission under the Privileged security level.
